Welsh Ambulance Services Integrated Medium Term Plan

This year's Integrated Medium Term Plan (IMTP) was approved by the Welsh Government on 13th July. Our plan is shaped by the Emergency Ambulance Services Committee (EASC) Commissioning Intentions, the requirements of the 111 Programme Board, and policies and strategies developed at Welsh Government level; notably the Six Goals for Urgent and Emergency Care but also by our belief that we can play a greater part in delivering the right care and advice, in the right place, every time. Despite the challenges, our plan is ambitious but deliverable.

We will be working closely with partners and continue to listen to our colleagues and service users to refine, and potentially redefine, our organisational purpose as we continue to develop our ambitions. Welsh Ambulance Services Primary School Campaign 'Shoctober'

Once again, the Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust will be visiting primary schools across Wales during October to promote 'Shoctober'. A campaign which aims to teach junior school children lifesaving skills. Pupils will learn about CPR, recovery position, defibrillators and how to deal with someone choking.


